- I. The meeting was called to order at 3:33pm by Schmidt
- II. Approval of the Agenda
 - a. Motion to approve.

- III. Approval of the January 11, 2022, Minutes

- IV. Call to Audience
 - a. No one present
- V. Discussion and Action Items
 - Action Item: Approval of undesignated credit grant in the amount of \$4710.60 towards the approximately \$9421.20 cost of football helmets that exceed current safety minimums
 - *i.* Guthrie (not present) Budget Subcommitee recommendation*i.* Unanimously voted to recommend to school council (Schmidt)
 - ii. Motion Schuneman
 - iii. Second Ranjel
 - i. Rincon vs. UHS student roster of team -was this taken into consideration when split 50/50? (Tellez)
 - 1. Yes, it was. Other sports that are primarily UHS and minority Rincon are split 50/50, so this was considered to do the same (Schmidt)
 - ii. Coach Copeland came to both administrations to discuss current safety standards. Over half of helmets have expired. More safe helmets = visibility of football program and help recruit. One of the many upgrades to equipment taking place (Ranjel)
 - iii. Are there secondary sources out of site council helping ot fund? (Marchant)
 - 1. There are additional entities helping to fund, the remainder was split between Rincon & UHS (Schmidt)
 - iv. Rincon only approved \$2500 (Schmidt/Marchant)
 - v. After this, we'd still have just under \$40,000 left in budget; would need \$14,000-\$16,000 reserved for stipends (Schmidt)
 - vi. Coach Copeland presented on helmets and safety improvements1. Significant increase in head injuries this past year
 - vii. What is the price per helmet? Shelf-life? (Marchant)
 - \$335/helmet and shelf-life of 4 years without anything being done or having to be thrown out. After every season, the helmets are refurbished. Shelf-life of new helmets higher than the ones we currently have (Copeland0
 - viii. Thank you to Coach Copeland for being concerned with safety of students and bringing this forward! (Rosenberg)
 - *iv.* Result: PASSED (17 in support; 3 opposition; 1 abstain)

- b. Action Item: Approval of the addition of the Applied Sustainability course to the UHS course registry
 - *i.* Apaez-Gutierrez- Recommendation of Curriculum Subcommittee
 - *i.* Recommends approval of the course
 - *ii.* Applied Sustainability approved by district board (Schmidt)
 - *ii.* Motion Morris
 - *iii.* Second Ranjel
 - i. Is this an elective? (Marchant) Yes! Student choice.
 - *ii.* Approval does not necessarily mean the course will run, allows students select it if they choose to. Will only run if enough students sign up to take it. Can be taken as a 1 semester course or 1 year. (Apaez-Gutierrez)
 - *iii.* We don't have a lot of semester courses to go along with Honors Econ and Health, this will help offer another option of semester classes. (Schmidt)
 - iv. Worried about how this class will affect other electives in science. Is very similar to AP Environmental Science. Many students take AP Biology as a senior, so this might conflict with enrollment in Biology or doing twice of what they already know without expanding new knowledge. Being presented as a class that has 0 homework. Worried students will take it because there is no homework vs. wanting to take the subject (Nieves)
 - *v.* Conversations/interests amongst students AP Biology still popular amongst those students who are interested in sciences and applying to particular universities/colleges. Sustainability

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seems to offer an opportunity to bring some balance to some seniors schedules or interests (Palos)

- vi. With creation for engineering class, the conversation was similar.
 4th years science carries more weight, students still encouraged to take biology if that's a path they're interested. Don't present the class as a 4th year science (Schmidt)
- *vii.* Do we find ourselves in need of more electives? Do we have people who can't get into electives? Is there a need for this class based upon scheduling? (Marchant)
 - Students we're often placing in electives such as Yoga, etc., when students are still identifying passions or finding an elective that suites their needs would benefit all students to help them find electives that aren't in fine arts & engineering. Want to be able to provide comprehensive options to all students (Evans)
- *viii.* Very interested in having electives, but concerned about similarities to what we already have. We do need more electives, but maybe not this class. (Nieves)
- *ix.* From the student perspective, for those students not interested in AP science course senior year, other electives would be nice (Titus)
- x. Would this count as a science credit? (Quihuis) No
- *xi.* Currently enrolled in AP biology and based upon description would not take sustainability instead of biology (Quihuis)
- xii. It was not advertised or presented as a hard science, doesn't think students looking for 4th year of STEM would surpass biology for sustainability. As far as AP Enviro, this is required, so it wouldn't interfere with electives necessarily. (Kim)
