 - i. Motion-Schuneman

 - b. (Guthrie) under action item B, couldn't' tell if it was something coming from budget or other sources. (Schmidt) no this is money granted from the state based on APs and grade level tests (AZ Merit/ACT), limited ways this can be used, site council has voted for it to go primarily towards teacher bonuses

 - i. ACT testing last Thursday (April 7) & CPR for senior graduation

 - b. Policy Review Subcommittee Report
 - i. Shared proposed changes to policy document with staff at PD

 - ii. Would like to table to get more feedback and discuss from stakeholders
 - iii. (Salyards) what's the make up of IC? (Ranjel) department chairs, admin, librarian, site council chair

VI. Discussion and Action Items

- a. Discussion Item: How to obtain stake-holder data about the proposed policy revisions regarding; student reduced schedule request approval policy and suggested homework load per day and gathering information about the possible introduction of a common calendar of student testing and other student responsibilities.
 - i. (Rosenberg) PA meetings, share background and seek feedback
 - ii. (Palos) challenge success questions/data? Can we resend some of these post covid? Those about homework, work load, responsibilities?
 - iii. (Schmidt) discussing there what might be included on calendar.
 - iv. (Ranjel) working on surveying current students by grade about homework, etc. Collecting data at student of the month: Whats your favorite thing? What would you change if you were principle? Seniors answered a survey last week at CPR/grad requirement meeting.
 - v. (Mandolini) band keeps a comprehensive calendar to integrate
 - vi. (Schmidt) looking to expand on this for all fine arts
 - vii. (Morris) how can we survey students to see if this would be helpful?
 - viii. (Palos) can we not use the one on the website already?
 - ix. (Schmidt) we're discussing how we will moderate calendar so it's not so crowded
 - x. (Stuart) how we define assessments will help clarify what goes on the calendar
 - xi. (Kim) student towns halls reflect the idea that a calendar for tests and significant assignments, and events would be helpful
 - xii. (Gribble) teacher perspective, adjusting schedule of tests/quizzes based upon where students are at is good pedagogy

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- xiii. (Miller) freshman & sophomore leaving are worried about proportion of grade based on tests and stress of overall workload
- xiv. (Nieves Pichardo) gives test dates, moderates test materials based on what's been learned, learning is continuous
- xv. (Schmidt) how do we get this information from a wider group of people?
- xvi. (Morris) I took this to a WL meeting and asked what they thought was best. WL classes are very mixed grade levels, it would be really hard to accommodate all grade level assessments in a mixed level class.
- xvii. Discuss at faculty meeting
- b. Action Item: Grant Request \$10,000 towards approximate \$24,000 to send 7 FBLA members and advisor to the FBLA National Leadership Convention in Chicago.
 - i. Motion-Ranjel
 - ii. Second- Morris
 - iii. (Schmidt) Before \$14,000 of approved grants from last meeting, and without setting aside \$17,000 for stipends, balance on budget is \$54,000, \$23,000 in excess of those items
 - iv. (Salyards) do we want to carry info over? Do we expect other large grant requests like this?
 - v. (Schmidt) because of the COVID year, we had less request for large sums like this. In years past, we've had less than \$15,000 moving from one year to the next. We try to not completely bottom out budget.
 - vi. (Salvard) should we offer more?
 - vii. (Schmidt) this was the dream amount. Herring also looking at CTE funding as well.
 - viii. (Guthrie) foundation can help up to \$250 as well
