## VI. Discussion/information items

- a. Building Community: How to create closer ties between UHS stakeholders
  - i. Ollanik: How do we do this? What does it mean to be "part of the UHS community?"
  - ii. Rosenberg: Increase in-person meetings reducing Zoom options, get more face to face time
  - iii. Kirk: 2<sup>nd</sup> Rosenberg's ideas. Before COVID there were mor frequent announcements to parents. Movement to online communication has lessened engagement
  - iv. Ollanik: UHS owned/operated business lists
    - 1. How to compile?
    - 2. How to use as preferred vendors for school purchases
    - 3. Rosenberg: This would be especially useful for Grad Night planning
  - v. Titus: Junior level came into UHS community during online freshman year. Juniors didn't have the usual freshman experience and continue to challenge the way UHS does things. Move towards Challenge Success to help make the changes they wish to see in the school
    - 1. Schmidt: Challenge Success has a student club for those students looking to make those types of changes
  - vi. Kirk: Could the list of businesses tie into internships
  - vii. Tellez: Or Alumni mentorships
  - viii. Kirk: How to get the word out about UHSFAA events
    - 1. Possible move to on campus alumni events?
  - ix. Pendolino: Club fair but for parents
    - 1. Chance for parents to learn about different outreach opportunities
  - x. Gribble: Asking students what is bothering them
    - 1. Students reply that they haven't been asked before
    - 2. Don't feel that there is a strong communication method for their complaints
    - 3. Need a way for students to voice concerns
  - xi. Ideas entered into Zoom Chat:
    - 1. Overnight class retreats
    - 2. Parent mixers
    - 3. Class fundraisers
    - 4. Class sponsors

- b. Family Engagement: How to expand parent/family involvement
  - i. Ollanik: Could we do something similar to Arts Under the Stars but for clubs to show what they are doing, could this tie into Pendolino's idea for "Club Fair for Parents"
  - ii. Kirk: Cohort groups for parents by student grade level?
- c. Campus Improvement: Senior projects, cleanliness, construction/development
  - i. Ollanik: what about the idea of "Senior Projects"
    - 1. Ranjel: Idea must predate the late 1990's
  - ii. Could we require/recommend a certain amount of community service hours
    - 1. Ranjel: Could also involve Rotary or other Service Organizations
  - iii. Kim: Students have campus ideas, mini-projects could be great
  - iv. Gribble: Facilities themselves leave much to be desired
    - 1. Bathroom situation on campus is really bad
    - 2. 1:55 ratio of toilets to students is horrible
    - 3. AZ Dept of Ed does not appear to have a standard, but this is out of compliance with other states requirements
    - 4. No proposed solution here, but it is a serios problem at school
- d. Fiscal Security: Health of the Site Council budget; encouraging donations
  - i. Ollanik: How do we raise donations to undesignated tax credit fund?
  - ii. Schmidt: The problem is not that donations are necessarily going down, it is that most of the donations coming in now are designated towards a specific student (i.e. travel club accounts) or specific programs (like a specific club)
  - iii. Schmidt: Better question might be: How to increase the pool od donators?
  - iv. Rosenberg: Neighborhood walks: get information to a wider swath of donators
  - v. Ollanik: Perhaps an 80/20 campaign: 80% or donation to specific club, 20% to undesignated?
