University High School Credit Recovery - One Year Option Only

Due to circumstances known and unknown during the Covid-19 pandemic, University High School will offer credit recovery for students who did not earn credit for courses taken at University High School from August 2020 to May 2021.

The following guidelines are to be upheld:

- 1. These credit recovery options are only for courses taken during the Fall 2020 and Spring 2021 semesters at University High School.
- 2. All credit recovery courses must be completed before the first day of classes of the 2021-22 school year at University High School August 4, 2021.
- 3. All credit recovery courses must be completed through APEX or from a UHS in-person summer school course.
- 4. Credit recovery taken in APEX must have the same name and designation of rigor (AP or Honors) as those that were taken at UHS.
- 5. Courses taken through APEX with prior approval from UHS administration are for credit recovery only except: Health (.5 credits) and Physical Education (1.0 credits). The grade replacement will consist of a grade of P.
- 6. Teachers who are willing may award graduation credit to students who pass AP exams with a score defined in advance by the credit awarding teacher.
- 7. The following unique situation exists for Honors Trigonometry/Pre-Calculus:
 - a. Students who failed either 1st semester Honors Trigonometry or 2nd semester Honors Pre-Calculus should take either Honors Algebra II or College Algebra through APEX over the summer.
 - 1. This ensures four years of math while attending UHS and allows students to meet math prerequisites and graduation requirements without having to take more than 1 math class during the normal academic year.
 - b. Honors Trigonometry/Pre-calculus must be retaken in person at UHS during the 2021-22 school year. This will also allow the student to replace the failing grade with a letter grade rather than a P.
